Poster Preparation Guidelines

Poster presenters need to send to <u>submissions-pracedays@prace-ri.eu</u> a high-resolution PDF by **7 March 2016** for printing or bring their poster with them printed in colour on A1 sized paper.

Format and size

- Posters should be prepared for printing on standard A1 size, portrait orientation
- Posters should be submitted as a high-resolution PDF (300dpi recommended)

Title

• At the top of the poster, the title of the poster should appear

Authors and affiliations

- Below the title, the major contributing poster authors should be included with their affiliations (this list ideally should not surpass two lines on the poster)
- Author affiliation logos may appear in the same general area of the poster

Acknowledgements

- If your project was supported by PRACE, the text "The Implementation Phase of PRACE receives funding from the EU's Seventh Framework Programme (FP7/2007-2013) under grant agreement RI-312763 and from the EU's Horizon 2020 Research and Innovation Programme (2014-2020) under grant agreement 653838" should appear at the very bottom of the poster in small print together with the EU flag.

- If your project was supported by another funding organism, please include the appropriate acknowledgements.

General Poster good practise guidelines

- Stick to one font type in your poster and use two or at most three font sizes throughout your poster
- Ensure that any poster diagrams are of as high quality as possible (to prevent pixilation). 300 dpi is recommended.
- Ensure that any text appearing in any diagrams you include is readable and of similar size to your lowest poster font size

Award for Best Poster

The poster session is the perfect venue to share a provocative opinion, interesting established or preliminary work, or a cool idea that will spark discussion. There will be a dedicated Poster Session during which poster presenters can discuss their work, get exposure, and receive feedback from attendees.

All selected posters will be entered into the contest for Best Poster. Review of the posters will take place on **Tuesday 10 May 2016** during the **Poster Session**. The PRACE Scientific Steering Committee (SSC) and PRACE Industrial Advisory Committee (IAC) will review the posters and listen to short talks by the poster authors to assess the quality of the posters. Poster authors should be available to explain their poster during the poster session. Posters that do not have their author present will not be considered.

The Award for Best Poster consists of a diploma and a token prize, as well as a voucher for €1 500 which can be used to attend an HPC training or conference (based on reimbursement of real costs).

Publication

In co-operation with the author, PRACE will publish the abstracts of the selected posters on the conference webpage of the PRACE website (http://www.prace-ri.eu/PRACEdays16) together with a photo and details of the presenter (name, institution, country, short biography).
